My name is Lisa Kane

As often as I can, I plan to share with you what I've learned from the Bible. I will include the scriptures and the script I used for each message down below for you to use as a reference tool.

First, if you don't have a Bible, you can access the Bible from www.biblegateway.com. I'll be using this for scripture screen prints in the video and in the script below, and the version of the Bible I will use will be the New King James Version unless otherwise specified.

I truly hope that each of these messages will help you in your Spiritual growth with God. With this message and the next one on Water Baptism, the plan is to build you up from this foundation. I look forward to seeing you grow spiritually.

Here's a little background on me. My name is Lisa Kane and I became a born again Christian in June 1975. I was water baptized in 1978. Since then my heart has been after everything related to God. I enjoy researching and seeking time with God whenever I can. Everything I share with you through here will have supporting reference material to help you see what I found in spending time with God.

Since this is the first video upload of this ministry, the starting point for this ministry will be on salvation. You really can't understand the rest of this without having the foundation of salvation as your rock.

You may have heard of some form of salvation somewhere along the road of life, which is wonderful...this message is going to show you why you need to be saved, where the message of salvation is located in the Bible and how you will always know that you're saved no matter what happens going forward.

So why must you be saved?

First, we need to know why we are here in order to understand salvation.

We are here because we're created in Christ Jesus for good works. In the beginning after God created this world, a war began. God threw Satan out of heaven and it had an effect on us since then. We're at war, and this life as we know it isn't an option. We're here for a specific reason and it is in Christ Jesus

for good works. We need to be sharing and doing these good works so that everyone can see who God is and believe in Him. So even though we can get distracted by everything in this world, this world isn't permanent. It will come to an end. And that end could be good or could be bad depending on salvation.

And I saw the dead, small and great, standing before God, and **books** were opened. And another **book** was opened, which is *the **Book of Life***. And the dead were judged according to their works, by the things which were written in the **books**.

Well, it's plain and simple and no gentle way to say this. If your name isn't found in the Book of Life you will be cast into the lake of fire. Now there's no need to get offended here. God needed to make a place for evil to suffer, and there is evil in this world. Take a look at terrorists, murderers, liars, cancer, sickness, disease, pain, suffering, hate...there's a place for these things and its hell.

But know this, Jesus offers mercy to anyone who wants to ask for forgiveness. We can hope and pray that all do just that.

So you say, but why Jesus?

When God created this world and Satan was thrown out of heaven, he came to this Earth and deceived Eve and Adam. Once they sinned, it started a chain reaction still going on today.

So God decided to send His Son to save us and there is no other way. Jesus can't lie and He said He is the Way, The Truth, and The Life, no one comes to the Father except through Him.

That's the why.

Next, let's check the Bible on where the message of salvation is:

Romans 10:13 in all English translations

Note, this same message is in two places. In the New Testament Romans 10:13 and in the Old Testament Joel 2:32

Notice, this message is for EVERYONE! There's no distinction between race, gender, etc. The term 'whoever' means just that. Anyone can call on the name of the Lord and be saved.

Now you're probably wondering how to 'call' on the name of the Lord? It's actually easier than picking up the telephone. ☺

The word 'Confess' from dictionary.com means the following:

confess

verb (used with object)

1. to acknowledge or avow (a fault, crime, misdeed, weakness, etc.) by way of revelation.
2. to own or admit as true:
I must confess that I haven't read the book.
3. to declare or acknowledge (one's sins), especially to God or a priest in order to obtain absolution.
4. (of a priest) to hear the [confession](#) of (a person).
5. to acknowledge one's belief or faith in; declare adherence to.
6. to reveal by circumstances.

verb (used without object)

7. to make confession plead guilty; own:
to confess to a crime.

8.
to make confession of sins, especially to a priest.
9.
(of a priest) to hear confession.

Look at number 5 – to acknowledge one’s belief.

Did you also notice in Romans 10:9 that it says to confess ‘WITH YOUR MOUTH’?

In essence, the verse is telling you to acknowledge with your mouth. Very simple.

What do you acknowledge?

The Lord Jesus

So in essence, you say out loud “Lord Jesus”.

The next part of the verse tells you to ‘Believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead’.

How do you believe?

Here’s what the word Believe means according to dictionary.com:

believe

verb (used without object), **believed**, **believing**.

1.

to have confidence in the truth, the existence, or the reliability of something, although without absolute proof that one is right in doing so:

Only if one believes in something can one act purposefully.

verb (used with object), **believed**, **believing**.

2.

to have confidence or faith in the truth of (a positive assertion, story, etc.); give credence to.

3.

to have confidence in the assertions of (a person).

It says to be confident. I like to take this further and elaborate that when you speak out loud to God by saying “Lord Jesus” you are speaking to someone you can’t see or hear. The action of speaking out loud is a step of faith and the bold confidence of speaking to someone you can’t see comes from this action. So the inherent action here is the believing with the heart.

So in essence you just need to say “Lord Jesus” out loud to God as if He is standing in your presence and you’re saved.

Now let’s talk about confessing the sins part. The confession of the sin delivers (saves) you from that sin. There’s a mystery here. If you declare Lord Jesus over that sin or issue you’re dealing with, example health or finances, you are placing God ahead of that issue and the outcome is deliverance or ‘saved’. Saved from sickness. Saved from finances, etc.

I took this further and searched the keyword statement confess your sins in Bible Gateway and this is the verse that came up:

Notice James 5:16 speaks of confession for healing and Nehemiah 1:6 is for generational sins. Both are for deliverance and healing. In essence, the confession saves you in the here and now.

For salvation, confession is acknowledging The Lord Jesus by saying it out loud.

You can see already just from the few scriptures in this message the power of the tongue. Your mouth is going to be your tool in working and dealing with spiritual activities.

Now, going back to Romans 10:9 and 10:

Romans 10:9-10 New King James Version (NKJV)

⁹ that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.

Verse 10 goes on to tell us the result of the action you take with your confession. Your heart in taking that step of faith by speaking out loud to someone you can't see or hear leads you to righteousness and the words you spoke with your mouth leads you to salvation.

Let's pray together this saying: Dear Jesus, I call on your name Lord Jesus and confess I have sinned. Thank you for saving me. Amen.

That was simple...

Now let me show you how no one can tell you otherwise:

Now that you prayed the above, you placed on your head a protection or a helmet to be more specific. You are now wearing a helmet made of Salvation:

Ephesians 6:17 [Full Chapter]

And take the **helmet of salvation**, and the sword **of** the Spirit, which is the word **of** God;

When you wear a safety hat in a construction zone, you are protecting your head from dangerous falling items or anything that could hurt your head in that environment.

Since you are now entering the spiritual environment, your confession is placing your helmet on your head. This is going to protect you from anything anyone throws at you to try to confuse you or mislead you. This helmet is your protection.

How do you use it? Simple. Remember always that you confessed 'Jesus is Lord and believed in your heart that God raised Him from the dead' and you are saved. No one can tell you otherwise. It's the Angels in heaven that are writing down our names in the books.

By your confession, your name is now written in the Book of Life that I mentioned earlier, and I like to think that it is written in the blood of Jesus because He died for you on the cross with His blood. Blood stains and no matter what happens, no one can remove your name from this book.

Here are those two scriptures again regarding the Book of Life and judgment day:

It makes sense now doesn't it?

Let me just say that the action you took a minute ago caused a lot of people to get excited including the Angels.

Luke 15:10 [\[Full Chapter\]](#)

Likewise, I say to you, there is joy in the presence of the **angels** of God over one sinner who repents."

Joy is now reverberating through heaven and Earth because of your confession.

With all that said, now you know why you need to be saved, where salvation is in the scriptures, and why no one can tell you that you aren't saved.

Realize this, this is the first step in a relationship with God. I suggest picking up the Bible or going online to biblegateway.com and reading the gospel of John as a beginning to help you understand who Jesus is. Basically, you just were introduced to Him...so now is the time to get to know Him.

I also suggest you find a church that uses the Holy Bible as it's foundation in its teachings. You need to surround yourself with sources of God to help you get through the challenges you face every day in life.
